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SLW Unveils Weekly Show Via Podcasting

Wiffle®Ball Inc. Asks for the Classic to Become a Sanctioned Event

Colorado Springs, Colo. – Associate Commissioner Cain's idea to find new channels to distribute Shangri La' news and updates has materialized in the form of podcasting. Show ideas are currently in development and input is welcome. In the inaugural edition, Cain and Commissioner Hixson cover topics such as possible first round picks, general tournament information and the potential legal issues with Wiffle®Ball Inc.

"This is a huge step forward for Shangri La' Wiffleball," Hixson stated. "Ideas like this are what make Jeff Cain such an integral part of this league. We now have a way to literally have our voices heard and discuss the issues of the day relating to this great league."

In unrelated news, Commissioner Hixson was contacted Wednesday by Dave Mullany, President and CEO of Wiffle®Ball, Inc. Mullany asked that Shangri La' Wiffleball become a sanctioned Wiffle® league. Unfortunately, the standards required for certification preclude SLW in its current format from qualifying. The following is an excerpt from one of the documents received:

"During any game sponsored by the Association, there shall be no consumption of alcoholic beverages, no use of tobacco products, no drug use no foul language, no inappropriate behavior or clothing which may in any way demean or denigrate The Wiffle Ball, Inc. or its products."

President of the SLWAA Geoff Hixson was enraged by the request as well as the language in the certification documents. "What kind of rule is that?" the eldest Hixson said. "It is my opinion that all of the things mentioned in that bylaw, except for the drugs, are required for a first-class wiffleball experience. I get the drug thing as I'm not a pot head, Focker. But the rest? Come on."

Commissioner Hixson declined comment on the Wiffle® issue at this time.

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
